Aim

- Introduce qualitative research, distinguish it from quantitative research, and highlight the utility of each
- Explore the critical role of the researcher in qualitative research
- Examine commonly employed research methods and tools
- Understand how to design qualitative studies, data analyses frameworks and and guidelines for recording, processing, analysing, interpreting, and presenting data.
